

Fire Extinguisher Safety

Course Description

Fire Extinguisher Safety gives an overview of the fundamentals of proper fire extinguisher use. The course illustrates the causes of school fires, even showing some historical examples. The various classes of fires are also clearly presented so that learners are aware that the proper fire extinguisher must first be selected before attempting to extinguish a fire. Detailed illustration is also given on the proper technique of using a fire extinguisher.

- Presents the five classes of fires as defined by the NFPA
