Course Description

SafeSchools' *Incident Command Systems* course is designed to give an overview of the National Incident Management System, or NIMS, as well as its most important component, the Incident Command System (ICS). Although the language may be unfamiliar, NIMS and ICS simply represent another way of forming a committee to accomplish a certain task. ICS is a committee model to ensure that the activities which need to be carried out are accomplished smoothly, and have designated personnel performing specific tasks.
